Funds raised through this event will go to pay for caregiving costs - Larry needs assistance 24 hours a day! He is also in need of a \$60,000 surgery to remove a cyst and scar tissue that are not only preventing



Larry from meaningful recovery in the area above his injury, but leave him in immense pain and discomfort in parts of this body that he cannot otherwise feel.
